



(#175979) \$125.00 Includes much on trials of former officials and torturers under the Shah, the outbreak of the Iran-Iraq war, Iran's role in near eastern

politics and diplomacy, Khomeini as a role model for world revolutionaries, etc. Also included is a special issue from July 1, 1981, 4 pages, devoted to the leaders who were killed in a guerrilla attack.






